# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE HIGH POWERED COMMITTEE HELD ON 18th AUGUST, 2023 IN THE OFFICE OF SIKKIM SLSA

A meeting of the High Powered Committed chaired by Hon'ble Justice Meenakshi Madan Rai, Judge, High Court of Sikkim and Executive Chairperson, Sikkim SLSA/Chairperson, High Powered Committee was held on 18.08.2023 (*Friday*) through virtual mode.

The Meeting was attended by Mr. Sudhakar Rao, IPS, Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department, Government of Sikkim/Member, High Powered Committee; Ms. Subarna Rai, Member Secretary, Sikkim SLSA, Mr. Sharab Tonyot, Deputy Inspector General of Police (Prison)/Member, High Powered Committee; Mrs. Tshewang Doma, Additional Secretary (Confidential), Home Department/Member Secretary, High Powered Committee and Mr. Sonam Wangdi Bhutia, Additional Superintendent of Police, District Prison, Boomtar, South Sikkim/Member, High Powered Committee.

## AGENDA ITEMS

Item Agenda No. 1 : Confirmation of the Minutes of the Meeting of the High Powered Committee which was held on 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2023.

The minutes of the meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2023, stands approved and confirmed.

### Item Agenda No. 2: Decongestion of Jails

The slow release of funds pertaining to construction of the barracks at the State Central Prison, Rongyek, was brought to the notice of the High Powered Committee The Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department informed that the matter pertaining to payment to the contractor was forwarded to the Finance Department and concurrence has been obtained along with Cabinet approval. The payment to the contractor will now be released.

With regard to the vertical extension of the C & D Cells of District Prison, Boomtar, Mr. Rao apprised that the Mines & Geology Department has opined that it is not feasible to have a vertical extension of the barracks and the matter will now be taken up with the Buildings & Housing Department for framing a roadmap for construction of prefabricated structure to resolve the problem of overcrowding.

## **RESOLVED:**

It was resolved by the High Powered Committee that the Buildings & Housing Department in tandem with the Home Department be requested to work out the modalities for preparing a roadmap for extension of cells in the District Prison, Boomtar with prefabricated structures.

## **RESOLVED:**

With regard to UTP Narbu Sherpa, Dawa Dorjee Tamang and Ruben Rai, considering that they are recidivists and unable to furnish sureties, the High Powered Committee, therefore, recommends requesting the concerned Learned Courts to expedite their trial.

STATE CENTRAL PRISON, RONGYEK, EAST SIKKIM - 02

It was reported by the Member Secretary, Sikkim SLSA that default bail has been granted to the above two UTPs, however, they have been unable to furnish surety as revealed at *Item Agenda No.* 2 *Sl. No.* 2(*b*). However, the concerned Learned Courts are to be requested to expedite trial.

(UTP Manoj Tamang, Melli PS Case No. 20/2023 dated 08.08.2023, under Section 7/14 Sikkim Anti Drugs Act, 2006 read with 9(1)(b) Sikkim Anti Drugs Amendment Act, 2017, has tested positive for Tuberculosis on 11.08.2023 and admitted at District Hospital, Namchi for further management/treatment).

The High Powered Committee has requested the Additional Superintendent of Police (Prison) District Prison, Boomtar to ensure that treatment of UTP Manoj Tamang is properly carried out and the complete dose of DOTS is administered to the UTP to prevent him becoming a victim of Multi Drug Resistant TB (MDR).

As suggested by the Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department, the High Powered Committee has resolved to request the jail authorities to ensure compulsory blood test and other body fluid tests to be carried out for inmates who complain of health issues. Additionally, the blood tests of all convicts shall be carried out on a half yearly basis and reports submitted to the High Powered Committee.

The High Powered Committee has also resolved to request the Health & Family Welfare Department to provide one portable ultrasound machine each for use by the doctors at the State Central Prison, Rongyek and District Prison, Boomtar.

The above UTP Arun Manger who has been recommended by the State Central Prison for release on bail, however, he is alleged to have committed the offence under Section 302, Indian Penal Code, 1860, which is punishable with imprisonment for life.

Vide email dated 29.05.2023 received from State Central Prison, Rongyek and 111/ASP/DPN/S dated 29.05.2023, received from District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that medical clinics are established in both the prisons and required medical facilities are available. No UTPs or Convicts in either of the Prisons are suffering from COVID-19 as of now. The Hon'ble Chairperson, High Powered Committee informed about the new variant of COVID-19 (ERIS) and requested the jail authorities to ensure adequate availability of medical facilities to the inmates. Item Agenda No. 4 : Continuation of sanitization and maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness in the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim.

Vide email dated 29.05.2023 received from State Central Prison, Rongyek and 111/ASP/DPN/S dated 29.05.2023, received from District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that sanitization is being carried out at the two Prisons on fortnightly basis and maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness is being carried out on regular basis as per COVID-19 protocol.

Item Agenda No. 5: Number of new UTPs since 23.02.2023 and the latest vaccination position of UTPs, Convicts, Officers and staff at the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim.

Vide email dated 16.08.2023 received from State Central Prison, Rongyek and letter No. 110/ASP/DPN/S dated 16.08.2023, received from District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that at the State Central Prison, there are 43 new UTPs and at the District Prison there are 22 new UTPs admitted after the meeting of the High Powered Committee held on 01.06.2023.

Further, at the State Central Prison there are 32 (*thirty-two*) UTPs who have not been administered precautionary dose of COVID-19 vaccine, 09 (*nine*) UTPs who have not been

administered second dose of vaccine and 02 (*two*) UTPs who have not been administered first dose of vaccine.

At the District Prison, Boomtar there are 83 (*eighty-seven*) UTPs who have been fully vaccinated, 03 (*three*) UTPs who have been given first dose of the vaccination and 01 (*one*) UTP who has not been vaccinated yet due to non-availability of vaccine in the District Prison.

They have also mentioned that all Officers and staff of the State Central Prison, Rongyek and District Prison, Boomtar have been fully vaccinated and have also been given the Precautionary dose of COVID – 19.

With regard to vaccination against COVID-19, the Member Secretary, Sikkim SLSA informed that the Health & Family Welfare Department has intimated this Authority that Serum Institute of India is currently manufacturing a vaccine called COVOVAX which is not in the list of vaccines prescribed in the COVID-19 vaccination guidelines. Accordingly, the Health & Family Welfare Department has been requested to confirm and inform the Sikkim SLSA as to whether COVOVAX can be administered to persons who are not yet vaccinated or have taken COVIDSHIELD or any other vaccination as first dose.

#### **RESOLVED:**

The High Powered Committee resolves that the Home Department shall take up the matter with the Health & Family Welfare Department and ensure that vaccinations are administered to the un-vaccinated or the inadequately vaccinated UTPs by November, 2023. The Home Department in tandem with the Health & Family Welfare Department shall be responsible for necessary action on this aspect.

# Item Agenda No. 6: Present mode of production of UTPs before Courts and continuation of Video Conference for remand.

Vide email dated 16.08.2023 received from State Central Prison, Rongyek and letter No. 110/ASP/DPN/S dated 16.08.2023, received from District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that all the UTPs required to be produced only for remand to various Learned Courts are being produced through Video Conferencing. Rest in all trial matters the UTPs are being produced physically.

Item Agenda No. 7: Steps taken for and progress of counselling of UTPs and Convicts by Psychologists and Psychiatrists at the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim (UTPs, convicts under SADA and UTPs, convicts with mental illness, other UTPs and convicts in need of counselling;

Vide email dated 16.08.2023 received from State Central Prison, Rongyek and letter No. 110/ASP/DPN/S dated 16.08.2023, received from District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that at the State Central Prison, Psychiatrist and Clinical Psychologist are visiting State Central Prison, Rongyek on a fortnightly basis. UTPs and Convicts under SADA/NDPS are given counseling thrice in a week (physically as well as through virtual mode) by Serenity Home, Burtuk, Sikkim.

While at the District Prison, Boomtar, Psychiatrist from STNM Hospital and Clinical Psychologist from the District Hospital, Namchi are visiting the Prison on fortnightly basis and weekly counselling programmes (*on virtual mode*) on SADA/NDPS are being conducted for the inmates by Serenity Home, Burtuk, Sikkim under the aegis of Sikkim SLSA.
