A. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Any act of violence or abuse against a single woman, sister, widows, mothers, daughters or even women in live-in relationships amounts to domestic violence. Women can seek protection Violence Act, 2005.

Any indecent act including lewd commentscats calls, or whistles, touching, groping indecent exposure that degrades the dignity of women comes under sexual and mental harassment. The offender is punishable by a maximum jail term of two years.

Plans and programmes have aimed at women's advancement in different spheres. India has also ratified various international conventions and human rights instruments committing to secure equal rights of women

DISCRIMINATION AT WORK PLACE

Homicide for Dowry, Dowry Deaths or their A major problem faced by the working women is sexual harassment at the work place.

> A majority of working women continue to be denied their right to equal pay, under the Equal Remuneration Act, 1976 and are underpaid in comparison to their male colleagues.

> The Hon'ble Supreme Court has laid down certain guidelines in Vishaka vs. State of Sexual harassment of women at workplaces.

MAINTENANACE WOMEN CAN CLAIM

A woman's legal right to claim maintenance from her husband is recognized under section 125 of the Criminal Procedure Code. Section 24, of the Hindu Adoption and Maintenance Act, 1956, entitles

a woman to claim maintenance from her estranged: extendable to her minor children. Further, these laws provide that maintenance can be claimed even prior to divorce, during separation.

Women are entitled to monetary help from spouses, parents or guardians in case of natural emergencies like treatment. Husbands cannot dispose of jewelery or dowry without consent of his wife. If he does he is guilty of economic abuse.
